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ACQUIRED BRAIN INJURY PROGRAM

Program

The program provides transitional community integration services for up to 15 children and youth with Acquired Brain Injuries living within Saskatoon and area.

Services

* Outreach-based support after school, evenings,

weekends, and during the summer.

* Flexible, individualised planning.

Participants

* Voluntary participation

* Referrals made by family, self, schools or the ABI Outreach Teams.

* Have an acquired brain injury.

* Enrolled in a school within the Saskatoon and area school divisions.

* Between 6-22 years of age.

Intake is continuous, and provided on a first-come first-serve basis.

YOUTH COMPANION PROGRAM

Program

The program provides one to one companions for high school aged youth with cognitive disabilities before & after school, early dismissal days and during the summer.

Parents remain at work or school, confident that youth are well cared for.

Services

* Hire, screen and train potential companions.

* Connect qualified companions with families in need.

* Support the families and companions, and assist with individualized planning.

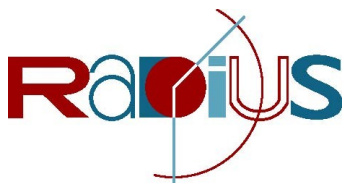
Participants
